Henry Named MAC Swimmer of the Week

Eagles have won conference award for every week of competition

CLEVELAND, Ohio (EMUEagles.com) — The Mid-American Conference announced Monday, Dec. 9 that Eastern Michigan University sophomore [Andrew Henry \(Garner, N.C.-West Johnston\)](#) was named MAC Swimmer of the Week. The award marks the first of Henry's career, and it is the third honor of the 2013-14 campaign for the men's swimming and diving program. Additionally, the squad has had a member named Swimmer of the Week for every week in which they have competed this season.

The Garner, N.C. native swam six events for the Eagles' win at the EMU Invitational, Dec. 6-7. He won the 400 IM with a time of 4:03.31 and also posted a season-best time in the 200 IM, touching in at 1:52.60. His performance in the 400 freestyle relay led to another first-place finish for the Green and White, and the team's time of 2:58.99 broke the pool record which had previously stood for 21 years. The sophomore was also a part of a 400 medley relay team that allowed the Eagles to come from behind Oakland University in the final event to win the meet.

Eastern Michigan's men's swimming and diving team will take a substantial break until Jan. 4, 2014, when the squad will travel to Miami, Fla. for the Florida International University Invitational.
