Henry Earns MAC Swimmer of the Week Honors

Sophomore claims second award of career

CLEVELAND, Ohio (EMUEagles.com) — The Mid-American Conference announced Monday, Jan. 27, that Eastern Michigan University sophomore [Andrew Henry \(Garner, N.C.-West Johnston\)](#) was named MAC Swimmer of the Week. The award marks the second of Henry's career, and it is the fifth honor of the 2013-14 campaign for the men's swimming and diving program.

The Garner, N.C. native led all Eagles in individual victories, winning all of his events in EMU's dual meets against Wayne State University and MAC opponent Ball State University. Overall, the Eagles clinched a 180-118 victory over the Warriors and a 163-115 decision over the Cardinals. Henry showed versatility across the board, as the sophomore won the 1000 free and 100 free in the matchup against Wayne State, while taking the 200 free against BSU. He touched in at 9:38.17 in the 1000 free, nearly 30 seconds ahead of Wayne's lead swimmer. He then won the 100 free in 45.23, a margin of almost two seconds over WSU's Till Barthel. Against Ball State, Henry's time of 1:42.34 was over two seconds faster than Drew Tharp's finish for the victory. Since the Eagles took such commanding leads over the Warriors and the Cardinals, many of the events were swum as exhibitions. Had those times counted, Henry would have also picked up victories in the 500 free against BSU and the 400 free relay against both WSU and BSU.

As the Eagles have completed their home schedule, they will travel to Oxford, Ohio to take on Miami University in the final MAC dual meet of the season. The matchup with the RedHawks is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m.
