DCI CHAMPIONSHIPS SLATED FOR AUGUST 13

The Seventh Annual Drum Corps International (DCI) Northern Championship will be held Friday, Aug. 13 at EMU's Rynearson Stadium.

The event, sponsored by The Ypsilanti Press and The Ann Arbor News, begins at 8 a.m with a daylong preliminary competition featuring 25 participating corps from Canada and the United States.

Championship finals, beginning at 7:30 p.m., feature the day's top 10 scoring units.

Tickets for the preliminary competition are all priced at \$4 general admission. Finals competition seats are reserved and priced at \$4 and \$7 each.
