SPRING ENROLLMENT FIGURES ANNOUNCED

Spring enrollment figures indicate 5,333 undergraduates and 2,434 graduate students are enrolled at the University for a total spring term headcount of 7,767.

The enrollment figures are for the one-tenth date of the term which is May 10.

When compared with the same one-tenth reporting date last year (May 7, 1981), the headcount increased in several categories but showed decreases in graduate enrollment and in total headcount.

New freshmen and special students attending college for the first time increased from 32 students last year to 156 students this year. Also, new transfer students increased by 42 students, from 98 students in 1981 to 140 students on campus this spring. The total undergraduate headcount at EMU is 5,333 this spring, an increase of 180 students from last year at the same reporting date.

Graduate student enrollment is 2,434, a decrease of 267 students from last year's total of 2,701. In addition, the total spring headcount decreased from 7,854 students in 1981 to 7,767 students on May 10 this year.

Credit hour production at the University is 35,842, an increase of 632 credit hours from last year's total of 35,210. Undergraduate credit hour production increased from 26,052 last year to 27,159 this spring and graduate credit hour production decreased from 9,158 credit hours produced last year to 8,683 credit hours produced this spring.

In addition, full year equated students (undergraduates enrolled for 15.5 credit hours per term and graduate students enrolled for 12 credit hours per term) increased from 2,444 students in 1981 to 2,476 this year. The figure includes an increase of 71 undergraduates and a decrease of 39 graduate students from last year at the same reporting date.

MEDICAL TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM IS ACCREDITED

The University's Degree Completion Program in Medical Technology has been granted an initial five year accreditation by the Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation.

The deadline for the June 15 issue of Faculty Staff News is 5 p.m. June 9.

The program was recommended for approval by the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences. EMU's Degree Completion Program in Medical Technology is designed so that students can complete two years of study at a community college, earning certification as medical lab technicians, and then transfer to EMU to complete requirements for their baccalaureate degrees. The program is one of five offered in Michigan that provides certified medical lab technicians an opportunity to complete requirements for a bachelor's degree.

The University also offers a four year medical technology program for students who do not hold certification from a community college.

FALL RELEASE TIME APPOINTMENTS AVAILABLE

A limited number of one-quarter release time appointments are available for fall 1982 for faculty interested in developing proposals for external funding of research, training or service projects. The appointments are being offered through the Office of Research Development/Graduate School Release Time Program and are intended to support faculty as they write proposals or coordinate major departmental/interdepartmental grant development efforts. The appointments are not meant to provide time for actually conducting research or for activities geared to individual professional development.

**FAREWELL PROGRAM FOR
RACKHAM SCHOOL PLANNED**

EMU's Rackham School for handicapped children, one of the first laboratory schools for handicapped children ever built on a college campus, will close its doors this June after 40 years of service.

The school is no longer needed in the Ypsilanti-Ann Arbor area because of passage of Michigan's Mandatory Special Education Act which delegates administrative responsibilities for special education programs to local school districts.

To commemorate Rackham School's more than 40 years of service to handicapped youngsters from throughout Michigan, EMU's Department of Special Education, which will still be housed in the Rackham Building, is sponsoring a special farewell program for anyone who has been affiliated with the facility over the years.
