### LIBRARY GETS COMPUTER

#### HOOK-UP FROM LIBRARY CONSORTIUM

The University's Library has been awarded an Ohio College Library Center computer terminal and compatible printer by the Michigan Library Consortium in Lansing with funds from the W. K. Kellogg Foundation.

The new computer terminal will allow library staff to file EMU periodical holdings into the consortium's computerized list of serials. Also, it will enable library staff to continue to list the library's monographs on the Ohio College Library Center's data base.

According to Dr. Morell D. Boone, director of the library, the use of the new computer

terminal and printer will assist EMU in making library holdings available to other Michigan libraries.

The center, based in Dublin, Ohio, is actually a network of more than 6,000 libraries in such places as Great Britain and Hawaii and throughout the U.S. It provides an on-line system with a bibliographical data base shared by the libraries that includes more than eight million cataloged entries. EMU has been part of the system since 1976.

The new computer terminal and printer will be on loan to EMU for two years.

### STUDENT ART EXHIBITION

The University's 1982 Student Art Exhibition will be held March 15 through 26 in the Intermedia Gallery of McKenny Union and in the gallery in Sill Hall.
