REGENTS APPROVE INTRAMURAL/AUXILIARY SERVICES ACCOUNT

Regents approved the establishment of a new Recreational/Intramural and Auxiliary Services Account in the amount of \$3 million, or ten percent of the total University debt obligation, at their regular meeting March 17.

Regents also recommended that any University student fee funds allocated to the construction of the new Recreational/Intramural Building but not needed for the project be deposited in the new account. The amount currently is estimated to be \$1.2 million.

They further recommended that proceeds from the recent sale of University property (40 acres) to the Catherine McAuley Health Center--\$1.2 million--and the net proceeds from future sales of University lands be deposited into the new account.

Also, Regents approved a recommendation that five percent--or not less than \$1.2 million--in student fee revenues be reserved each year for debt retirement and funding of the new account until it is fully funded.

Regents recommended that investment income from the new account be used to defray debt retirement costs of the new building and other indebtedness of the University.
