PRESIDENT PORTER TO DISCUSS FISCAL CRISIS AT EMU THIS WEEK

President John W. Porter will hold a series of 11 meetings with various employee groups and students this week (March 29 to April 2) to discuss the fiscal crisis facing the University.

President Porter is expected to discuss his concern over the state's economic deterioration and its potential impact on the University. Saying we cannot rely on an economic recovery in time to impact our 1982-83 General Fund Budget, he will present the alternatives for coping with an anticipated \$5 million shortfall in revenues during the fiscal year.
