Fellowships for College Teachers provide opportunities for teachers at two, four and five-year institutions to pursue full-time independent research and study that will enhance their capacities as teachers, scholars or interpreters of the humanities to the public and enable them to make contributions to knowledge and teaching in the humanities. Fellowships for Independent Study and Research are for scholars and others who have made significant contributions to thought and knowledge in the humanities or who stand at the beginnings of careers that promise such contributions.

Association to receive this year's prestigious Catalyst Award for teaching excellence and outstanding contributions to chemical education.

The award was presented April 16 at the EMU Chemistry Alumni and Awards Banquet held in McKenny Union.

The Catalyst Awards are presented annually to outstanding chemistry faculty at two and four-year colleges and universities and high schools.

Moore is the fifth person from the state of Michigan to receive the award. EMU is one of only 16 colleges and universities in the U.S. and Canada with more than one faculty recipient of the Catalyst Award during the past 26 years. Moore shares the honor at Eastern with Dr. Ronald W. Collins, associate vice president for academic affairs, who received the award in 1980.

Faculty

Department of Nursing - Temporary Lecturers - Specialization required in clinical nursing specialities - psychiatric nursing and pharmacology. Master's degree in specialization required. Doctorate preferred. Current clinical experience required with teaching experience at the university level preferred. In addition, applications are being accepted on an ongoing basis to enhance the applicant pool for future temporary positions.

- Tenure-track faculty positions - 1) 50% position to teach in the areas of

pathology and pharmacology in nursing. Requires current clinical experience, at least two years university level teaching experience and evidence of scholarly work. Doctoral preparation in pathology and pharmacology preferred but applicants with a master's degree and extensive experience will be considered; 1) 100 percent. Position to be responsible for classroom and clinical teaching in pediatric and community health nursing. Requires at least two years of university level teaching experience and evidence of scholarly work. Doctorate preferred, however, a M.S. in pediatric nursing and experience in community health nursing are necessary. Salary and rank commensurate with qualifications and experience. Completed applications are requested by June 4, 1982; however, the search shall remain open until the positions are filled.

Department of Psychology - Lecturer Positions (One full-time, several part-time) - Fall Semester, 1982.

Preference will be given to applicants who have a Ph.D. degree in psychology, but those who have completed all coursework but dissertation are eligible. Completed application, vita, three letters of recommendation and undergraduate and graduate transcripts are requested by June 11, 1982; however, the search shall remain open until the positions are filled.
