THE JOHN M. MUNSON LECTURE FUND



On January 30, 1942, Dr. E. A. Pittenger of Aberdeen, South Dakota, Class of 1912, tendered the Michigan State Board of Education an endowment to sustain an annual address at Michigan State Normal College to be known as the John M. Munson Address.

In a resolution expressing appreciation for this unusual gift, the State Board of Education agreed to carry out the purposes indicated and placed the money in custody of the Normal College Student Aid Corporation, the income to be used in securing annually a person distinguished in his field to give at the College the John M. Munson Address.

The first use made of the John M. Munson Lecture Fund is to provide the speaker for the first annual Honors Convocation at the Michigan State Normal College.
