### Deadlines

American Musical Society Subventions for Publications, Awards, and Research and Travel Grants

Supports individuals with expenses involved in the publication of works of musical scholarship. Goal is to defray costs not covered by publishers. Proposals that utilize newer technologies are encouraged. AMS Subventions for Publications awards range from \$500 to \$2,500 each (annual deadline: 2/16, 8/17). AMS 75 Subventions provide up to \$5,000 for first books from early career scholars (annual deadlines: 2/15, 8/15). Various awards for outstanding research and publications in music (annual deadlines: 5/1, 8/15). Also provides small Travel and Research Grants (annual deadlines: 4/1, 6/1, 8/15).

Spencer Foundation, Field-Initiated Grants, Small Research Grants

Since the Spencer Foundation initiated formal grant making in 1971, its major and small grants programs have welcomed proposals from a wide variety of fields on a virtually unlimited range of topics and issues related to education. This 'field-initiated' approach to grantmaking relies on researchers themselves to determine the most important issues to pursue. For these programs, the Foundation does not release "requests for proposals" on certain subjects of particular concern to the Foundation. The Small Research Grants program is intended to support education research projects with budgets of \$50,000 or less. In keeping with the Spencer Foundation's mission, this program aims to fund academic work that will contribute to the improvement of education, broadly conceived. Historically, the work we have funded through these grants has spanned, a range of topics and disciplines, including education, psychology, sociology, economics, history, and anthropology, and they employ a wide range of research methods.

National Endowment for the Humanities, Media Projects, Development and Production Grants

The Media Projects program supports film, television, and radio projects that engage general audiences with humanities ideas in creative and appealing ways. All projects must be grounded in humanities scholarship in disciplines such as history, art history, film studies, literature, drama,

religious studies, philosophy, or anthropology. Projects must also demonstrate an approach that is thoughtful, balanced, and analytical (rather than celebratory). The approach to the subject matter must go beyond the mere presentation of factual information to explore its larger significance and stimulate critical thinking. NEH is a national funding agency, so the projects that we support must demonstrate the potential to attract a broad general audience.

#### National Endowment for the Humanities, Public Humanities Projects

Public Humanities Projects grants support projects that bring the ideas and insights of the humanities to life for general audiences. Projects must engage humanities scholarship to analyze significant themes in disciplines such as history, literature, ethics, and art, or to address challenging issues in contemporary life. NEH encourages projects that involve members of the public in collaboration with humanities scholars or that invite contributions from the community in the development and delivery of humanities programming.

#### Sociological Initiatives Foundation

Supports projects that link research with a concrete social action strategy in order to find solutions to social problems. Applications are encouraged from academic-community partnerships and from academics that organize or link to a constituency through their research. SIF has funded projects in the areas of civic participation, community organizing, crime and law, education, health, housing, immigration, labor organizing, and language/literacy. Awards are from \$10,000 to \$20,000.
