ORDA Current Practices for Externally Sponsored Projects

The Office of Research Development and Administration (ORDA) has documented its current practices for [sponsored project procedures](#) on our website. This includes:

- The process and internal deadlines for review and approval of proposals,
- requirements for establishing a hardship fund (pre-award or bridge funds) for spending,
- other less-common occurring items like transferring awards between institutions.

While for the most part the procedure spells out our current practice, there is one change that will become effective in January 2018. ORDA will require that proposals be submitted for internal approval routing **five days in advance of the deadline** instead of the current three days. EMU is experiencing an increase in proposal activity, necessitating this change. Proposal activity increased 17% in FY2017 over FY2016 and proposal activity was up significantly in the first quarter of FY2018 when compared to the same period in FY2017. With this up-tick in activity, a longer period is needed to provide department heads and colleges sufficient time to review proposals and will allow the ORDA staff to better accommodate the needs of all PIs.

SPSS I Training

This "hands-on" workshop is for participants who have never used or feel out-of-date with the statistics package SPSS. The menu-driven system of the Windows version of SPSS will be demonstrated for performing common tasks such as: entering data into SPSS, creating variable and value labels, computer new variable, recording values, running selected statistical procedures, and saving data and output files. The SPSS I Workshop will cover the basics of this package.

Grant Writing from the Reviewers' Perspectives

You don't want to miss this fact-filled and down-to-earth presentation on how to write successful grants. Christine K Black, MLS, has been a research developer and administrator for over 30 years at the University of Michigan Division of Research Development and Administration, where she helped faculty across campus plan and write interdisciplinary and trans-disciplinary grant proposals. For the past two decades her research development activities included training (in proposal writing, compliance, budgeting, administration, and finding funding opportunities), developing web-based resources for research development and implementation, editing, and providing mentoring. Most recently, she created a program for young medical school faculty called the Mentored Research Academy: R01 Boot Camp. Ms. Black is now retired and gives proposal-writing workshops at universities across the country.
