### **National Science Foundation, FastLane Phase-Out**

The National Science Foundation is rolling out Research.gov as a proposal submission system. As of April 30, full research non-collaborative proposals can be submitted via Research.gov. Other proposal types will be added incrementally to the system. Eventually, Research.gov will replace FastLane, but for now, there are no changes to FastLane functions. Applicants may use either system. If you have questions about how this affects your proposal submission plans, please see your ORDA pre-award officer.

## **Deadlines**

Department of Education, Office of Innovation and Improvement

Notice seeking applications supporting efforts by educational agencies to create, develop, implement, replicate, or take to scale entrepreneurial, evidence-based, field-initiated innovations to improve student achievement and attainment for high-need students; and rigorously evaluate such innovations. Early-phase grants provide funding to support the development, implementation, and feasibility testing of a program, which prior research suggests has promise, for the purpose of determining whether the program can successfully improve student achievement and attainment for high- need students. Absolute priorities include: Demonstrates a Rationale; Field-Initiated Innovations—General; and Field-Initiated Innovations—Promoting Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math (STEM) Education, With a Particular Focus on Computer Science. Invitational Priorities include: Personalized Learning; and Early Learning and Cognitive Development.

Our Town is the National Endowment for the Arts' creative placemaking grants program. Through project-based funding, we support projects that integrate arts, culture, and design activities into efforts that strengthen communities by advancing local economic, physical, and/or social outcomes. Successful Our Town projects ultimately lay the groundwork for systemic changes that sustain the integration of arts, culture, and design into strategies for strengthening communities. These projects require a partnership between a local government entity and nonprofit organization, one of which must be a cultural organization; and should engage in partnership with other sectors (such as agriculture and food, economic development, education and youth, environment and energy, health, housing, public safety, transportation, and workforce development).
