On this day...On this day in 1901 - Walt Disney was born in Chicago. He created his first Mickey Mouse cartoon at the age of 27.

Quote: "Somehow I can't believe there are any heights that can't be scaled by a man who knows the secret of making dreams come true. This special secret, it seems to me, can be summarized in four C's. They are Curiosity, Confidence, Courage, and Constancy and the greatest of these is Confidence. When you believe a thing, believe it all the way, implicitly and unquestionably."- Walt Disney

Fact: Walt Disney's last name was actually changed from the original version of D'Isigny. Walt Disney's great-grandfather, Arundel Elias Disney, had emigrated from Ireland and he was a descendant of Robert d'Isigny, a Frenchman who had travelled to England with William the Conqueror in 1066. With the d'Isigny name anglicised as "Disney", the family settled in a village now known as Norton Disney, south of the city of Lincoln, in the county of Lincolnshire.
