**SHOULD WE BE WORRIED ABOUT THE EARTH'S SOIL?:** Campus Life is pleased to welcome David Montgomery to EMU to speak about "*Dirt: The Erosion of Civilization*," on **Tuesday, February 19**, at 7 p.m., in the Student Center Auditorium. Montgomery is the author of 'Dirt: The Erosion of Civilizations,' which makes the case that we are using up Earth's soil. Once bare of protective vegetation and exposed to wind and rain through agriculture, cultivated soils erode bit by bit, faster than they can be naturally replenished. The erosion is slow enough to be ignored in a single lifetime but fast enough over centuries to limit the lifespan of civilizations. In this engaging lecture, Montgomery traces the role of soil use and abuse in the history of societies, from Mesopotamia to European colonialism and the American push westward. He explores how soil has shaped us and we have shaped soil. This is a free event and is open to the public, no tickets required.

Fact:

The [Toledo War](#) (1835–1836), also known as the Michigan-Ohio War, was over a boundary dispute between the U.S. State of Ohio and the adjoining territory of Michigan. Michigan was nicknamed the "Great Lakes State", and also the "Wolverine State", from a nickname earned during this war.

Originating from conflicting state and federal legislation passed between 1787 and 1805, the dispute resulted from poor understanding of geographical features of the [Great Lakes](#) at the time. Varying interpretations of the law caused the governments of Ohio and Michigan to both claim sovereignty over a 468-square-mile region along the border, now known as the Toledo Strip. When Michigan sought statehood in the early 1830s, it sought to include the disputed territory within its boundaries.
