NEW YORK TIMES COLUMNIST JOE NOCERA TO SPEAK AT EASTERN: It's the ultimate ethical tug of war, played out in the classrooms and playing fields of the major universities whose athletes flash across your TV and computer screens. How should the athletes who generate so much money be treated? How can you ensure they get an adequate education? Joe Nocera, a columnist with The New York Times, will address such topics during a talk entitled, "*How To Fix Big-Time College Sports*," at EMU **tonight, March 19**, 5 - 6:45 p.m., in the Student Center Auditorium. The talk, which will include an ample question and answer period, will be preceded by light refreshments at 5 p.m.

Nocera, who became an Op-Ed page columnist for The Times in April 2011, has written frequently about problems with the NCAA and college sports. He has proposed giving players and coaches more due process rights, and has called for athletes at big-time schools to be treated like any other student on campus. Recently, Nocera devised a plan to pay college football and men's basketball players at major schools, using a salary cap formulation. Sponsored by EMU Student Government.
