EMU's CHEMISTRY DEPARTMENT RANKS 21st IN AWARDING MASTER'S DEGREES

According to data recently compiled by the American Chemical Society (ACS), EMU's Chemistry Department ranks 21st nationally in the number of master's degrees granted during the 1978-79 academic year. The top 25 schools compiled by the ACS using that criteria included the University of California-San Diego, Yale University, Northwestern University and Harvard University.

Eastern would place second nationally in the number of master's degrees awarded if universities granting chemistry doctorates were eliminated from the ACS list, Dr. Ronald Collins, former head of the Chemistry Department, remarked.

REGENT DYER HAS BUILDING NAMED IN HIS HONOR

The Board of Education of the Wayne-Westland Community School District has voted to name a new \$8 million lifelong learning facility in honor of Dr. Timothy J. Dyer, superintendent of schools in Wayne-Westland and an EMU Regent.

The board named the facility the Timothy J. Dyer Educational Social Service Center "in honor of his professional commitment to lifelong learning and in recognition and gratitude for his aggressive pursuits which have brought this concept to a physical reality."
