Fact:

[SpaceShipOne](#) is a suborbital air-launched spaceplane that completed the first manned private spaceflight on June 21, 2004. The craft was designed by Burt Rutan and piloted by Mike Melvill. It reached 328,491 feet above Earth during a 90 minute flight. The height is about 400 feet above the distance scientists consider to be the boundary of space.
