COVID-19 Campus Update – March 10, 2022

The following excerpt from President Smith's March 10 message to campus pertains to the University's response to the pandemic:

COVID-19 Cases, Dashboard

The number of COVID-19 cases involving students and employees has declined for the eighth consecutive week. In the seven days ending March 8, the University administered 624 COVID-19 tests that resulted in two positive cases, for a positivity rate of 0.32%. A total of nine positive cases were confirmed during this period.

The [University's COVID-19 Dashboard](#) continues to add updated data, including the high vaccination rates among our students, faculty and staff. Free COVID-19 testing remains available at the campus [Testing Center](#).

If the University continues to experience a low number of cases over the next week, there will be renewed consideration of modifying some of our COVID-19 protocols. We need to get past the two-week period following the return from spring break to determine if there is any significant increase in cases. As we get to the end of next week, we should have a clearer picture. Please continue to follow your campus email for updates.
