DEAN APPOINTED FOR COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY

Dr. Alvin Rudisill, head of the Department of Industrial Technology at the University of Northern Iowa, has been selected to serve as the first dean of Eastern's College of Technology, the unanimous choice of the University's Board of Regents.

Rudisill, selected from a field of more than 70 applicants, earned his bachelor's degree from Moorhead State College, a master's degree from the University of North Dakota and a doctorate degree from the University of Northern Colorado.

Rudisill has earned numerous honors for his outstanding contributions to higher education. He is an active consultant and lecturer and has published many articles in professional journals. He is a past vice president of the American Council on Industrial Arts Teacher Education and served as president of the American Industrial Arts Association from 1975 to 1976. Also, he has held several offices in state and national industrial education organizations.

His appointment, subject to formal approval by the Regents in August, is effective Sept. 1.

FINANCIAL AID DIRECTOR APPOINTED

Courtney O. McAnuff, director of financial aid at the State University of New York, College at Farmingdale, has been appointed director of financial aid at Eastern.

McAnuff replaces Lee Fawcett, former director of the EMU Office of Financial Aid, who resigned his position last January.

McAnuff earned his bachelor's degree from the City College of New York and a master's degree from Hofstra University. Since 1976 he has administered the Financial Aid Office at SUNY, College at Farmingdale which awards more than \$9.3 million in student aid annually. Also, he serves as a part-time instructor working with disadvantaged adults at SUNY's Farmingdale Educational Opportunity Center.

His appointment, subject to formal approval by Eastern's Board of Regents at its regular monthly meeting in August, is effective Sept. 1.
