Regents approve Auxiliary Fund budget

Eastern's Board of Regents approved the 1981-82 Auxiliary Fund budget at its May 27 meeting. The Auxiliary Fund budget totals \$16,346,019, an increase of 15.5 percent from the 1980-81 estimated actual operations. The Auxiliary Fund budget supports such University operations as apartments, residence halls, food services, Hoyt Conference Center, McKenny Union, Snow Health Center, rental property, internal services, the Kresge Environmental Education Center and student activities.

Computer aided design technology program approved

A new bachelor's degree program in computer-aided design technology was approved by the Board of Regents May 27. The new program will be offered through Eastern's new College of Technology and is the first full program to be offered by a Michigan college or university and one of a select few in the United States. Of 150 schools surveyed, only the University of Houston offered a total program in this area. The program will begin with the fall 1981 semester.

Regents approve contract with UAW Locals 1975 and 1976

EMU's Board of Regents approved two new labor agreements with UAW Locals 1975 and 1976 at its May 27 meeting. Both agreements provide for five percent salary increases for all bargaining unit members on the University's active payroll as of July 1, 1981. In addition, salary ranges for each pay grade and classification will be increased by five percent. The new labor agreements were ratified by union members at meetings held Tuesday, May 12.

Master's degree in liberal studies adopted

Regents approved a new master's degree in liberal studies May 27. The new degree program is a relatively new concept in graduate education. The intent of the new program is to offer mature students a master's level program that is interdisciplinary in design and nonprofessional in orientation. It is not specifically intended to train students for a particular vocation, to provide accreditation for a profession or to prepare students for further graduate study in a specific field. The program will be initiated with the fall 1981 semester.

Police sergeants ratify contract

Five EMU police sergeants represented by the Fraternal Order of Police had their new labor agreement approved by EMU Regents May 27. The labor agreement provides for salary adjustments that will increase the bargaining unit's 1981-82 fiscal year payroll cost by approximately five percent. The new contract was ratified by the union Tuesday, May 12.

National Teaching Center director appointed

Dr. Winifred I. Warnat, a research professor in the School of Education at American University, was appointed director of Eastern's National Center on Teaching and Learning by EMU Regents May 27. A native of Michigan, Warnat earned a bachelor's degree in history and a master's degree in human behavior, both from Florida Atlantic University. She earned her doctorate in counseling and social psychology from American University in 1971. She has served as a research professor at American University since 1977. Her appointment is effective immediately.

McCloud promoted to associate dean in Graduate School

Dr. George E. McCloud, an assistant to the dean of the Graduate School and a part-time associate professor in the Department of Speech and Dramatic Arts, was promoted to associate dean of the Graduate School by EMU Regents. As associate dean, McCloud will be responsible for administering admissions, records and student recruitment. He will conduct an ongoing assessment of graduate degrees offered by the University and investigate the development of new degree programs. His appointment is effective immediately.
