Chairman Robb called the meeting to order at 11:05 a.m.

The Chairman explained to the Board members and audience that they were going to experiment with a new format. He explained that it will be divided into three sections. The first section will consist of a consent agenda to be determined by the President in regard to those items which do not constitute a policy action. One resolution approving the entire consent agenda will accompany that section of the Board agenda.

The second section will include those items which are policy and call for individual Board action.

The third section, (Regents Forum) will be held in the Tower Room to hear substantive presentation by task forces appointed by the staff or the Board of Regents. Hopefully this will bring faculty, staff and students into an open discussion.

Chairman Robb asked if there were any corrections or additions to the preliminary minutes of the meeting of February 29, 1984.

Regent Dyer moved and Regent Ellington seconded the preliminary minutes be approved as presented.

Motion carried.

.2864 M RESOLUTION: MEN'S INDOOR TRACK TEAM

Chairman Robb asked Regent Ellington to read the Resolution regarding the Men's Indoor Track Team, to be received and placed on file.

WHEREAS, the Eastern Michigan University men's track team won the unofficial Mid-American Conference indoor track championship March 3 in Bowen Field House, scoring 195½ points to second place Western Michigan's 133 points; and

WHEREAS, seven Hurons won events at the meet, including Earl Jones in the 1,000 meter run, Daryl Curry in the 300-yard dash, Bradford Horton in the 800-meter run, Michael Calhoun in the 400-meter dash, Joe Codrington in the 600-yard run, Dan Shamiyeh in the two-mile run and the distance medley relay team of Mark Brosnan, Tom Elliott, John Qudsema and Chris Los; and

WHEREAS, the men's track team also won the Central Collegiate Conference Indoor Track Championships held February 17 and 18 at Bowen Field House, scoring 156 points to the University of Michigan's 121¼ and defeating such other teams as Notre Dame, Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan State, Marquette, Minnesota, Northwestern, DePaul, Western Michigan and Central Michigan; and

WHEREAS, the Hurons won eight events, including Earl Jones in the 800-meter run and the 1,500-meter run (in a Bowen Field House varsity and Central Collegiate record time), Anthony Abbott in the high jump; Jim Hensel in the pole vault, David Beasley in the 600-yard run (in a Bowen Field House and CCC record time), Mark Smith in the 5,000-meter run, Michael Calhoun in the 400-meter dash, and the distance medley relay team of Joe Codrington, Eric Frederick, Earl Jones and Dan Shamiyeh (in a Bowen Field House and varsity record time); and

WHEREAS, Coach Bob Parks was named coach of the year in the CCC and Earl Jones was named outstanding athlete of the meet; and

WHEREAS, the distance medley relay team of Joe Codrington, Eric Frederick, Dan Shamiyeh and Earl Jones won the NCAA national title March 10 in Syracuse, N.Y., the first team from a Michigan school ever to win an NCAA national relay title; and

WHEREAS, the Hurons tied Indiana, Georgia Tech, Texas A & M, Southeast Missouri, Alabama and Oklahoma for 12th place in the nationals; and

WHEREAS, Earl Jones also qualified for the 1,500-meter run and David Beasley and Michael Calhoun qualified for the 500-meter dash at the nationals;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents congratulates the men's track team and Head Coach Bob Parks for an exceptional season of accomplishment and commends them for the honor and distinction they have brought themselves and Eastern Michigan University.

Motion carried unanimously.

.2865 M RESOLUTION: MEN'S SWIMMING TEAM

Chairman Robb called upon Regent Milford to read the Resolution regarding the Men's Swimming Team, to be received and placed on file.

- WHEREAS, the Eastern Michigan University men's swimming team won its fifth consecutive Mid-American Conference Championship and sixth championship in seven years; and
- WHEREAS, the Hurons' point total of 518 was the highest point total scored in the history of the Mid-American Conference swimming competition; and
- WHEREAS, EMU junior Kevin Miller was named Mid-American Conference "Outstanding Swimmer," EMU sophomore diver Tom Michael was named "Outstanding Diver," EMU senior Tom Smith was named "Outstanding MAC Senior," and EMU Head Coach Mike Jones was named "MAC Coach of the Year" for the fifth consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years; and
- WHEREAS, the Hurons had 11 first place finishes at the 1984 Mid-American Conference Championships; and
- WHEREAS, Tom Smith won his third consecutive 400-yard individual medley championship; and
- WHEREAS, Kevin Miller qualified for the NCAA National Championships and finished 19th in the 1,650-yard freestyle and ninth in the 500-yard freestyle events, thus becoming the first Eastern Michigan University swimmer ever to score points at the NCAA Division I nationals; and
- WHEREAS, Kevin Miller was named the Hurons' first-ever NCAA Division I All-American and also qualified for the 1984 United States Olympic Trials;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents congratulates the men's swimming team on its outstanding performance and commends it for its excellent representation of the University in this athletic arena.

Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Robb asked President Porter if he had any comments at this time.

President Porter noted he just wanted to bring to the Regents' attention the five additional items for their agenda:

- Chairman Robb noted he had received a letter from Dave Taylor, the past Student Body President, for permission to address the Board, but due to his absence from his office last week it did not get on to the agenda. He queried the Board if there would be any objection to have Dave come forward at this time. Hearing no objection, he asked Mr. Taylor to make his report.

Dave Taylor thanked the Board for permitting him to report on the progress made during 1983/84 by the Student Government during his reign as President. Mr. Taylor referred to the following subjects:

2. Increasing Student Input
3. Serving the Campus
4. Serving Individuals
5. Working on the Local, State, and National Levels
6. Improving Communication and Involvement
7. Using Resources Responsibly
8. Providing for Effective Transition and Training

Chairman Robb congratulated Mr. Taylor for a successful year and stated he hoped that Dawn Schumann would be equally successful.

Chairman Robb noted they would move to the Consent Agenda at this time but asked each Regent if there was any section they wanted pulled from the Consent Agenda. Sections 5, 6, 12 and 13 were pulled for questions.
