## THEATER TO HOST PLYMOUTH PARK PLAYERS

"Fieffer's People," a collection of scenes about our human foibles, will be presented at Quirk Theater by the Plymouth Park Players on July 8 and 9 at 8 p.m.

July 8 is tribute night for the Plymouth Park Players, who returned recently from the Spectrum Festival's sixth international invitational in Villach, Austria. The high school troupe was invited to perform at the festival after gaining national recognition at the Thespian Honorary Society's national conference last summer.

National Institute on Aging Research Programs

Social and Behavioral Research on Aging - This program supports research which addresses the social, cultural, economic and psychological factors that affect the process of growing old and the place of older people in society. The four major emphases include: the dynamic character of aging; the inter-relatedness of old age; the social and cultural variability of age; and the multiple facets of age and aging.

Health and Effective Functioning in the Middle and Later Years - This program invites proposals for research projects designed to specify how psychosocial processes, interacting and biological processes, influence health and functioning in the middle and later years. A wide range of research topics apply.

Preliminary proposals or telephone conversations with NIA are recommended two months prior to submission. The next submission deadline is Nov. 1, 1983. Contact Richard Howard at 7-3090 for guidelines.

The Small Business Administration is accepting proposals for research studies on the following topics:

HENRIKSEN AWARDED NCAA POSTGRADUATE AWARD

Erik Henriksen, a senior on the EMU track and cross country teams, has been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship for postgraduate study by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). Henriksen is one of just 25 college athletes from all NCAA schools to win such an award in 1983.

Henriksen is the third Huron to be awarded the postgraduate scholarship. Baseball pitcher Ken Bruchanski won the award in 1975 and basketballer Dan Hoff was a recipient in 1976.

Henriksen was named Eastern's scholar-athlete for men's sports in 1982 and 1983 after recording his 3.95 GPA.
