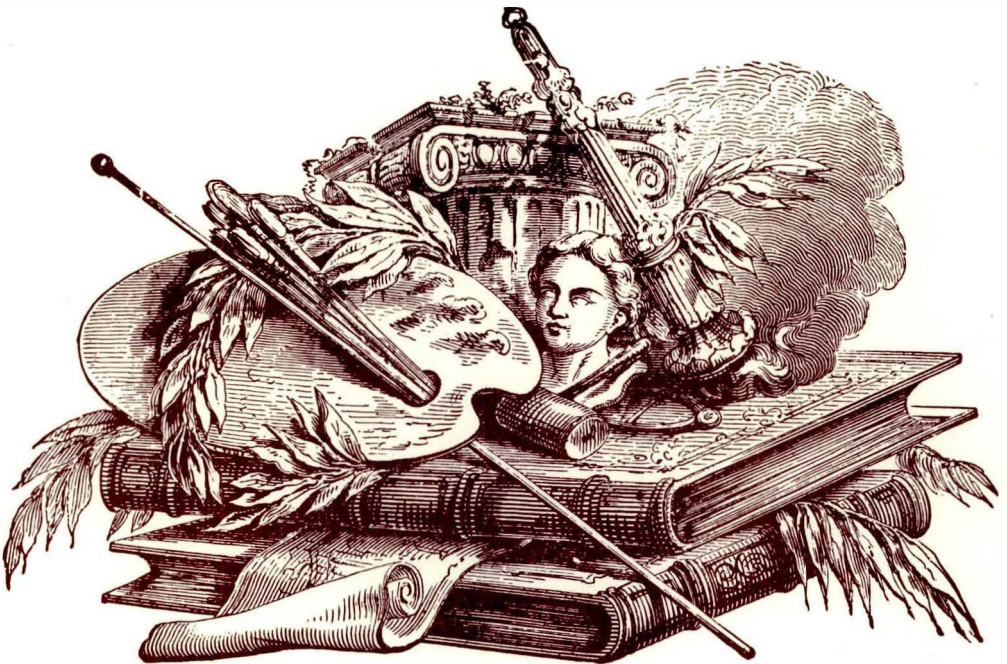

ACADEMIC PROCESSION AND SYMBOLS

The academic procession preceding the commencement ceremony is the direct descendant of ecclesiastical processions, which include the stately and orderly movement of celebrants to the place of sacred ceremony. As the church was for centuries the main force behind intellectual enrichment, the religious overtones of the academic procession are not surprising.

The procession begins with the University mace, which is a symbol of authority of the President and the Board of Regents, the University's governing body. The mace, designed and constructed in 1980 by EMU graduate Mark Hall, represents the golden flame of learning. The University mace is carried by the Grand Marshal. Grand Marshals are selected on the basis of their service to the University. The keys of the bursar represent permission to enter and freely employ the resources of the University for the advancement of knowledge. Appropriately, these keys are symbols of the buildings on campus. The charter carried by an executive officer represents the original academic design of the University. The University seal is carried by the secretary of the Board of Regents. The chief academic officer carries the book representing knowledge, the source of wisdom. The University colors symbolize a heraldic representation of the University.

Faculty participants in the ceremony are led by Deans bearing the collegiate flags; Arts and Sciences—white; Business—drab; Education—light blue; Health and Human Services—mint green; and Technology—gold. Distinguished faculty are selected to lead in their colleagues.

All undergraduates wear gowns of the same color. The colors of trim on the graduate level gowns signify the different graduate degrees. The custom of wearing gowns stems from the time when all students of higher learning were members of the clergy and therefore wore the garments which the church considered appropriate for them. The wearing of caps dates from early Roman history when the right to wear a cap was conferred upon slaves when they were granted their freedom. The "Mortarboard" worn today may be a combination of the tight fitting cap worn indoors by the scholars in the Middle Ages and the soft biretta worn out of doors. The tuft of the early cap has been replaced by a tassel. The green and white tassel worn by the graduates represents the colors of Eastern Michigan University.

The Grand Marshal

Ruth Anna Gray, the Grand Marshal, is an assistant professor emeritus in the Center of Educational Resources. Gray earned her bachelor's in education and master's in library science degrees from the University of Michigan. She was managing editor of the Michigan Law Review from 1949 to 1966 and business manager from 1945 to 1949. Gray has served on the faculty at Eastern Michigan University since 1966. She is a member of the American Association of University Women and a past member of the American Library Association, the Michigan Library Association, and the Washtenaw County and Michigan Historical Societies.

The University Mace

Historically, the mace was a battle club used by men on horseback to injure footmen. As weapons became more sophisticated, it became a symbol of learning and power.

Constructed of sterling silver, gold plated brass and padauk, a wood resembling mahogany, the mace carries the symbols of each area of the University: the arts, business, education, health and human services, science and technology.

The University mace was designed and constructed by Mark Hall, who earned his bachelor's degree in art from Eastern, while completing requirements for his master's degree in fine arts at the Cranbrook Art Academy.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

Rose Lee Hayden

Dr. Rose Lee Hayden is executive director of the National Council on Foreign Language and International Studies. The council, established in 1980 upon the recommendation of the President's Commission on Foreign Language and International Studies, is this country's single most important advocate for foreign language and international education.

Hayden earned her bachelor's degree from Cornell University, her master's from Columbia University, and her doctorate from Michigan State University.

She began her career as an instructor of romance languages at MSU and acting director of its Latin American Center. In 1974, she became associate director, and subsequently director, of the America Council on Education, where she was an advocate of international education legislation. From 1978 to 1980, she served as deputy director of the Peace Corps for Latin America and the Caribbean. In 1980, she served as staff director for U.S. government exchanges policy for the United States International Communication Agency.

Hayden has played an important role in helping to establish Eastern Michigan University's highly successful Language and International Trade Program. She encouraged EMU to obtain initial funding for the program from the U.S. Department of Education, and most recently she helped the program win another grant from the Exxon Education Foundation. Due in large part to her efforts, our program is now nationally recognized as a major program model in language and international studies.

Hayden is the author of more than 20 articles for professional publications and has delivered many keynote addresses and conference presentations in her area of expertise.

Celeste Holm

Celeste Holm, the Commencement speaker, is a woman of many facets. She has won the Oscar, the Sarah Siddons Award, the Brotherhood Award of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the Performer of the Year Award, and has been dubbed into knighthood by King Olav of Norway.

After studying drama at the University of Chicago, Holm made her stage debut in the Pulitzer Prize-winning Theatre Guild production of "The Time of Your Life." Her legendary interpretation of Ado Annie in "Oklahoma!" firmly established her reputation as a stage actress.

Under contract to 20th Century Fox, Holm received Oscar nominations for "Come to the Stable" and "All About Eve." She received the Academy Award for her outstanding performance in "Gentlemen's Agreement." Among her other screen credits are "The Tender Trap," "High Society," and more recently Walt Disney's "Blue Grass Special" and the musical remake of "Tom Sawyer."

On television, Holm has appeared as a continuing character on "Archie Bunker's Place," won critical plaudits for John Cheever's "The Shady Hill Kidnapping," and received an Emmy nomination for her performance as Mrs. Warren G. Harding in "Backstairs at the White House." She also has appeared on "Love Boat," "Columbo," "Captains and Kings," and "The Streets of San Francisco," among many others.

Holm has continued to appear on the stage, both on Broadway and in regional theatre. Among her Broadway credits are "The King and I," "Back to Methuselah," "Third Best Sport" and "Invitation to a March." She has toured with "Light Up the Sky," "Butterflies Are Free" and "Candida." Her performance in the title role in the national company of "Mame" won her the Sarah Siddons Award.

Holm is vice president of the New York Arts and Business Council and president of the governing board of the Creative Arts Rehabilitation Center. In 1982, President Reagan named her to a six-year term on the National Arts Council and in 1983 she was appointed chairman of the New Jersey Motion Picture and Television Commission. She is the recipient of many awards and honors for activities outside of her profession, particularly in the field of mental health and rehabilitation.
