PLANNED NETWORK DOWNTIME: There will be a planned network downtime on **Friday, Mar. 20**, 6 p.m. to midnight to perform maintenance of EMU's wireless (WiFi) network and wired network. During this maintenance, all campus buildings will experience network service interruptions of approximately 1-2 hours. Computing systems hosted at EMU will be sporadically unavailable during this outage. The following services are affected:

- WiFi / Wireless Network - all buildings - authentication services will be unavailable for up to one hour during the window.
- Wired Network - Network equipment configuration updates will occur for the following buildings interrupting services for approximately 20 minutes or less per building. Buildings that will experience a service disruption during this outage include:
