1992 final fall enrollment falls slightly over 1991

EMU's final 1992 fall semester enrollment declined less than 1 percent compared to the same time in 1991.

EMU's final 1992 fall semester enrollment totaled 25,836 students, a 0.4 percent decrease from the final 1991 fall enrollment of 25,939.

Undergraduate students totaled 19,461, a 0.8 percent increase over the previous fall's 19,298, while final fall graduate enrollment in 1992 totaled 6,375 students representing a 4 percent decrease from 1991's 6,641.

There were 15,074 returning students to EMU in fall 1992, up slightly from 1991's 15,030. The number of new freshmen at EMU was 2,042, down 5 percent from

1991's 2,160. Transfer students totaled 2,246, a 14 percent increase over 1991's 1,966.

The 1992 final fall student credit hour production totaled 252,353 hours, represent-
