EMU AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS LAUNCH WATER DRIVE TO HELP FLINT RESIDENTS: A Flint Water Drive is under way on EMU's campus and at several community partner sites until **Friday, Feb. 12**. The goal is to receive more than 500 cases of bottled water, along with gallon and five-gallon containers of water to help Flint residents with the water crisis. GIFT OF LIFE CAMPUS CHALLENGE AT EMU: The Health Administration Student Organization (HASO) at EMU is leading the Gift of Life Michigan Campus Challenge, an organ and tissue donor drive competition among 12 universities in MI, now through Wednesday, Feb. 24. Students, professors, alumni and local community members can sign up on the Donor Registry, scoring a point for EMU and giving hope to those needing life-saving organ or life-healing tissue transplants. To sign up and credit EMU, visit GiftOfLifeMichigan.org/CampusChallenge, and select EMU from the drop-down menu, or watch for our HASO students staffing tables at the Student Center and elsewhere on campus.

At the end of the five-week competition, a trophy is awarded to the school with the most donor registrations and one to the school with the most registrations compared with student population. Signing up on the Michigan Organ Donor Registry is an easy, quick way to

give hope to the 3,500 residents of our state waiting for a life-saving organ transplant, and tens of thousands more who need cornea and tissue transplants to improve the quality of their lives.

The Gift of Life Campus Challenge is one of the most successful organ donation college outreach programs in the nation, and has been recognized by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services for its exceptional results. Since its inception in 2004, the Gift of Life Campus Challenge has inspired more than 36,000 people to join the state's Donor Registry. Gift of Life Michigan is the state's federally designated organ and tissue recovery organization, which acts as intermediary between donors, their families and hospital staff.

SEEKING STAFF AND FACULTY TO ENGAGE WITH STUDENTS AT THE LEADERSHAPE INSTITUTE: For the past 14 years, EMU has hosted a session of the LeaderShape Institute. This nationally renowned program is attended by approximately 60 EMU students each year. In addition, five EMU faculty and staff members work closely with these students throughout the week under the guidance of two certified lead facilitators from other institutions. This year's LeaderShape will be held **Tuesday, Apr. 26 through Sunday, May 1**, at a nearby camp and conference center. Training for Cluster Facilitators takes place on **Monday, Apr. 25**. Over the past decade, we have seen many tangible, positive outcomes based on the visions and goals students begin to develop when they participate in this powerful learning experience. These include the formation of the nationally recognized Poetry Society and many other new student organizations, annual performances and celebrations like the Colors of Harmony event, and innovative student-led collaborations and new initiatives.

We would not be able to successfully offer this program each year without dedicated faculty and staff who serve as the Cluster Facilitators for this week-long intensive leadership experience. While it is a significant time commitment, it is truly a rewarding experience for facilitators as well as students. IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR TRAVEL AND EXPENSE USERS IN CONCUR: Based on input from campus users, the Travel and Expense team has been working to enhance the travel and expense reporting experience. Beginning the week of January 25, two changes will affect expense reports as follows:

- For travel submitted after January 28, 2016, the per diems that will be used in Concur will be the Government's Department of Defense standard travel per diem for meals, located at **Per Diems Calculation Information**.
- Also, you will see an improvement to the workflow routing on Concur expense reports. The routing will now follow the approval flow of the org where an expense is charged in addition to the default manager.

P2P TECHNOLOGIES INFORMATION: Employees and students must now "opt-in" to use peer-to-peer (P2P) technologies on the EMU WiFi network. If you do not use P2P technology to download software updates or other data, no action is required on your part (and you can skip the rest of this message).

P2P technologies (such as Bittorrent) have a great deal of value for legitimate uses. However, these technologies are also frequently abused to illegally share copyrighted materials including films, music and textbooks. In some cases, this results in legal copyright infringement claims (called DMCA violations) against the EMU users, including lawsuits and fines. Torrents are also occasionally infected with viruses and other malware.

EMU fully supports the right to use these tools for legitimate purposes. EMU will help students, faculty and staff that need to use the technology to "Opt-In." This new process is intended to ensure that those using the technology fully understand their obligations and risks associated with P2P technologies. Those that opt-in will be able to use torrenting software on the EMU wireless network when authenticated using their NetID.

To opt in, go to **P2P Opt-In**. You may be prompted to login with your NetID/password. Read/accept the terms, complete the form, and click "Request Item." Information Technology staff will verify your identity and grant your NetID access to use P2P on the WiFi network. You will receive a notice when your request has been processed and your access is active. If you do not wish to click the link above to opt-in, you can also find the signup form link in our forms library. Navigate to: IT Web Site → "Getting Help" section → Forms Library → Network Request Forms heading → Peer-to-Peer Opt-In Request Form. EMU PUBLIC SAFETY TIPS AND REMINDERS: The EMU Police Department provides a variety of community service programs focused on safety awareness for our residential halls, classrooms and campus. These include crime prevention seminars, and training sessions and programs on sexual assault and alcohol awareness for faculty, staff and students. The EMU Police Department use high visibility foot patrols, mobile patrols, bicycle patrols and an extensive video monitoring system to help deter crime. It is important to report crimes or suspicious activities immediately -- police have a better opportunity to apprehend suspects and solve crimes.
