FLU VACCINATION CLINICS: There will be a flu clinic on **Friday, Mar. 18** from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in room 219 in the Snow Health Center. Flu season is in full swing, and the Washtenaw County Health Department (WCHD) has advised the University that influenza cases have been increasing over the past week, targeting otherwise healthy adults. The Snow pharmacy is a Blue Cross/Blue Shield (BCBS) in-network provider for flu vaccinations. This means that EMU employees with BCBS coverage can get these vaccinations for FREE. (Important: You must bring your insurance card with you when you come to get vaccinated). Students on the EMU student health insurance plan and those with BCBS coverage can get the vaccine for **FREE** by presenting their insurance card. Other students may also receive a flu vaccination at **no charge** through support by a grant to UHS. There is an option to get a flu shot or flu nasal spray. The cost is \$30.00 for those not covered by the plans above. Walk-in Clinic is Monday – Friday from 9 – 11 a.m., on the 2nd floor, Snow Health Center. EMU I.T. DEPARTMENT INTRODUCES NEW SERVICE DESK SYSTEM: The EMU IT Department is excited to announce that they are rolling out a new Service Desk system to help you more easily submit and manage your I.T. requests. The new system includes a service portal with the following features:

- Create an Incident (aka help desk ticket) via the "Create Incident" link.
- Create Service Requests for specific services via the "Create Service Request" link. This feature replaces many of the paper forms that were previously on the "I.T. Forms Library" web site.
- Check the status of your requests and incidents via the "My Requests" link.
- Search for answers to common I.T. issues/problems via the "Solutions" knowledge base or view solutions saved in the knowledge base via the "View Solutions" link.

You now have access to the new [I.T. Service Portal](#). Login with your NetID and password when prompted. The site also works well on mobile devices. To learn more about the basic portal features, login using the link above then search for "Service Portal" in the "How can we help you?" search box. From the list of search results, select the solution titled "I.T. Service Portal." If you have any questions about using this new service, please call the I.T. Help Desk at 487-2120.
