DR. JUNE KING MCFEE  
WILL LECTURE FRIDAY

The Art Department will host a lecture by  
Dr. June King McFee Friday, April 23, at  
7:30 p.m., in Lecture Room 2 of Sill Hall.

McFee, head of the Art Education Depart-  
ment at the University of Oregon, will be one  
of three honorary degree recipients at the  
spring commencement ceremonies.

McFee is well known by art educators  
throughout the U.S. as the author of "Prepa-  
ration for Art," one of the first text books  
to deal with the concepts and processes art  
students need to know to become art teachers.  
Published in 1961, the book is still used as  
a major text by art educators in the U.S.  
and Japan.

A reception in her honor will immediately  
follow the lecture in the Sill Gallery.
