EMU PROFESSOR HONORED BY GOVERNMENT OF PHILIPPINES

Dr. Quirico S. Samonte, a professor of education, has been selected by the government of the Philippines as the "Outstanding Filipino Overseas" in education for 1981.

Samonte's selection was made by a panel of Filipino judges that included the chief justice of the Philippine Supreme Court, the chairman of the National Science Development Board, the director of the Technological Resource Center of the Ministry of Human Settlements and a university president.

Samonte was one of several nominees selected by the government from such fields as agriculture, the arts, business, the humanities and science. He will be a guest of the Philippine government for a week in March when President Ferdinand Marcos will make the award presentation to recipients in Manila.

Samonte joined the EMU faculty in 1963 and has served in various capacities.

In addition to being an evaluator for the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education, Samonte has contributed numerous articles to various professional journals. Recently, he published a book of readings titled "Curriculum Development: Perspectives for Swaziland."
